Description	<p>The monument comprises the remains of a ring cairn, probably dating to the Bronze Age (c.2300 BC - 800 BC) and situated within open moorland on a terrace on Troedrhiwhir Mountain, above the confluence of the Nant Melyn and the Gwenfrwdd. The well-preserved ring cairn is circular on plan and measures about 9.5m in diameter within a stony ring bank spread to about 5m in thickness and up to 0.7m in height. The ring cairn is situated on a slight knoll, with wide views around the W arc and is overlooked by higher ground immediately to the E. At least three small subrectangular recesses are visible set into the inner edge of the NE side of the ring bank; each measures 0.6m in width by 0.7m transversely and is up to 0.2m in depth. deliberately placed within the well-defined inner edge of the ring bank, but may also indicate later reuse of the structure. The monument is of national importance for its potential to enhance our knowledge of prehistoric burial and ritual practices. The monument is well preserved and is an important relic of a prehistoric funerary and ritual landscape. It retains significant archaeological potential, with a strong probability of the presence of both ritual deposits and environmental and structural evidence. Its importance is further enhanced by the group value formed by its spatial association with similar Bronze Age monuments nearby, including the standing stone (CM353) situated to the SE and the stone circle and burial cairns to the NW and W (CM218 and 224 respectively).

road. It is fed by a stream in its SE corner which now flows out through a breach in the NW side. It presumably supplemented the water supply in the Cothi aqueduct below, though there is now no trace of any channels leading from it. It is believed to have been constructed in conjunction with the Roman exploitation of the gold mines at Dolaucothi, probably in the later 1st and early 2nd centuries AD. The multiple channels on this stretch are thought to represent an effort to overcome a particularly steep drop; above and below this stretch there is no sign of more than one channel. Its source was originally presumed to be near SN 707 436, on the upper reaches of the Annell, the valley of which it is assumed to follow, hugging the contour of the hillside, towards Caio, swinging westwards from there towards the main mine area. A similar portion to this, higher up this course, is scheduled as CM211. More recent work has suggested that the aqueduct may have extended further to the north-east, to tap the headwaters of the Gwenlais, which otherwise flows south-east towards Cilycwm. Parts of its course were probably carried on or supported by timber structures which do not survive. This is part of a network of leats serving the Dolaucothi mine, and an important demonstration of the sophistication of water management by Roman engineers. On this stretch, one main channel runs the entire length, starting at the north end with an apparently steep drop from a boggy area. After about 75m, when this levels out, it is joined by a second line below it. About 375m further on, the aqueduct passes a strong spring and to the south of this three channels are visible, the lowest channel appearing to start at the spring. This triple stretch is very clear and well preserved, although unfortunately the remains cannot be traced beyond the next field boundary. The monument is of national importance for its potential to enhance our knowledge of Roman structural engineering and mining technology. The scheduled sections of the monument are generally well-preserved and an important relic of their Roman construction. They retain significant archaeological potential, with a strong probability of the presence of both structural evidence and intact associated deposits.

Below this main channel, on the steepest part of the hill, lie two other parallel channels and traces of another, although any detail of how these other channels began and ended has been obscured, probably by water action. The fourth channel does not begin until about 40m beyond the beginning of the second and third channels, and ends quite abruptly. It may well be unfinished. There are some signs of a side channel capturing the small side stream and feeding it into the main channel. The monument is of national importance for its potential to enhance our knowledge of Roman structural engineering and mining technology. The scheduled sections of the monument are generally well-preserved and an important relic of their Roman construction. The area comprises the upper part of the middle reaches of the River Cothi and its valley west of Mynydd Mallaen on the southern fringes of the Cambrian Mountains. The flat, but narrow valley floor rises gently from 120m above OD at the Cothi's confluence with the Twrch at Pumsaint, to about 220m above OD in the north east of the area. The low rounded hills and ridges on either side rise steeply above the valley floor to between 250 and 400m above OD. Although the deciduous woodland covering most of the site makes the setting of some of the slighter features difficult to appreciate, the main opencasts, adits and trenches are clearly visible and well interpreted in laid out trails which cover the core of the mine. The interpretive facility run by the National Trust also includes significant underground sections which are open to the public. An active period of archaeological research in the early 1970s resulted in extending not just knowledge of the Roman operation of the mine, but also the contemporary landscape. Excavations demonstrated the existence of the long suspected Roman fort at Pumsaint, sited on meadowland (dolau) at the confluence of the Rivers Twrch and Cothi, controlling the crossing of the latter. It was also sited on a Roman route from Llandovery north along Sarn Helen. Survey was also carried out on the remarkable 8km length of contour leats or aqueducts which conveyed water from the headwaters of the Cothi, along the steep southern side of the valley to the mine. There were shorter lengths of leats bringing water from the River Annell along the eastern limits of the area. However, these latter lengths are less well-preserved because of afforestation and deep ploughing in recent times, and they remain extremely fragile and highly vulnerable to further damage. The area also includes the historic nucleated settlement of Caio, where most of the workers from the last phase of mine operations in the 1930s lived. The other settlements of Pumsaint and Cwrt-y-cadno are but hamlets in a classic area of dispersed settlement. The modern Caio forest on the north side of the village obscures its nodal position in a communication network which included upland Drovers' routes extending east across Mynydd Mallaen and beyond. The rare survival of a 9th century land charter as marginalia in the famous Llandeilo Gospels suggest that Caio may have been the centre of a Dark Age multiple estate.
